

Planting the Seed

Inspired by "The Key Jar" by Glennon Doyle Melton and Erin Waters at momastery.com, this activity is designed for kiddos on the spectrum, many of whom don't do so well with open-ended questions, but desperately need the conversation practice. It also serves as an excellent opportunity for you to connect with your child, and get a peek inside that brain. Consider this set of questions a starting point - I encourage you to come up with your own set, tailored to your kiddo and his or her special interests, which is always a sure way to engage them in conversation. Cut them out and laminate them, or paste them onto construction paper - there is no "right" way to do it.

When we first started this activity, The Boy kept asking why he had to choose, but after a few tries, we really started rolling.
